Reality—Carnal or Spiritual?

Lesson 5 – Teacher's Guide

- Carnal-mindedness is allowing our minds to be dominated by what we can see, taste, hear, smell, and feel (Rom. 8:6). "Carnal" literally means "of the five senses," or "sensual." Carnal-mindedness doesn't necessarily mean "sinful"-mindedness. We are carnally minded when our thoughts center primarily on the physical realm.
- Spiritual-mindedness releases the flow of God's life in us, but carnal-mindedness shuts 2. it off. Carnal mindedness = death, and spiritual mindedness = life and peace. "Death" means "anything that's a result of sin." In this fallen world, being dominated by our natural senses produces death.
- When our thoughts are dominated by what the Word says, we're spiritually minded (John 6:63). It doesn't matter what our physical circumstances may be-God can keep us in perfect peace (Is. 26:3). As our minds stay on Him, our souls agree with our spirits, and God's peace is released into our souls and bodies.
- We, as believers, shouldn't live like lost people, who are trapped in their carnal, 4. physical world (Eph. 4:17). A "Gentile" was a non-Jew, someone not in covenant relationship with God. Unbelievers don't use their minds to perceive spiritual truth.

When we walk like unbelievers, we get the same results—death. When our understanding is darkened, we are alienated from the life of God within us through ignorance (Eph. 4:18). Most of us live our lives separated from the life of God within, due to our own ignorance of spiritual truth.

6. Lasciviousness is being controlled by what we feel (Eph. 4:19). Most people have gone beyond simply receiving sensory input to being dominated by it. Feelings were designed to follow what we think, not lead the way.
